
















THE NATIONAL DIASPORA DAY CELEBRATION: **BEYOND REUNION OF NIGERIANS**

s a mark of honour to Nigerians living abroad, the Federal Government of Nigeria has designated July 25, every year as the National Diaspora Day. The inaugural Diaspora Day Celebration took place on July 25, 2005. So far, out of the 16 years of its establishment, 14 editions have been organised and celebrated. Now, the newly established Nigerians in Diaspora Commission (NiDCOM), under the Chairmanship of Hon. Abike Dabiri-Erewa has organised and celebrated two editions. These were held in 2019 (physically marked) and 2020 (by webinar due to COVID-19), and NiDCOM is set to host its third edition on July 25, 2021; being the 15th edition in a series of its 16 years of establishment.

Why celebrate the Diaspora? Why a special day for the Diaspora? These are pertinent questions agitating the minds of some Nigerians especially those at home. With an estimated demography of about 17 million Nigerians living outside the sovereign boundaries of Nigeria, sending home remittances of about \$25 billion US dollars annually. It becomes obvious that this segment of Nigerians deserve recognition and celebration and should not be ignored. It is also worthy of note that these home remittances are over 83 per cent of the National budget and 6.1 per cent of the Nation's Gross Domestic Product (GDP).

According to The World Bank and Price Water Coopers (PWC), these home remittances serve as economic buffers and safety nets to families for: school fees, feeding, hospital bills and many other support systems. Meanwhile, a chunk of the remittances are channelled into real estate and commercial businesses. Another reason, why Nigerians in the Diaspora should be celebrated, is the fact that many Nigerians living abroad are top level professionals in cutting edge technologies, medicine, engineering, energy, sports, entertainment, media, law, logistics and services, among others. These achievers have been celebrated globally by their countries of sojourn. This, naturally should be replicated by their country of birth; a sure way for national integration and development. Still on the matter of National Diaspora Day Celebration. It also provides a platform for networking, re-union and stocking-taking.

It serves as an opportunity for government to engage Nigerians more constructively- be it at macroeconomic level or in organised private sector for meaningful national impact and development. Meanwhile, the July 25, 2021 National Diaspora Day Celebration has as its theme: "DIASPORA INTEGRATION FOR NATIONAL PEACE AND DEVELOPMENT ". The idea is to anchor on the levers of peace to accelerate Diaspora engagement for national growth and development as no nation succeeds in an atmosphere anchored on bitterness, as well as, hatred and divisive tendencies. Key presenters to discuss the theme are: 1. Deputy Secretary-General, United Nations, Dr Amina Mohammed 2. President, African Development Bank, Dr. Akinwunmi Adesina 3. Chief of Staff to the President of the Federal Republic of Nigeria, Prof. Ibrahim Agboola Gambari, CON. A special feature is the celebrity interview with Dr Ngozi Okonjo-Iweala, Director General, World Trade Organisation (WTO).

The National Diaspora Day Celebration 2021 has a special attraction: the presentation of the National Diaspora Policy, adopted and ratified, by the Federal Executive Council (FEC).Of note, is a special segment dedicated to 2nd and 3rd generation of Nigerian Diaspora as a way of fast tracking the reconnection process with the homeland. 01

CONSTITUTION REVIEW: DIASPORA VOTING CATALYST FOR DEMOCRATIC GOVERNANCE

o you know that about one hundred and nineteen countries in the world conducts Diaspora Voting? As Nigeria moves towards the 2023 General Elections, questions are still being asked by Nigerians in Diaspora on how long they would be allowed to realize and exercise their constitutional rights in their country of origin. To this end, The Chairman/CEO, Nigerians in diaspora commission (NiDCOM), Hon. Abike Dabiri-Erewa, led other Diasporans to canvass for the rights of Nigerians living abroad on Diaspora Voting at the National Public Hearing on further alteration to the Provisions of the 1999 Constitution of Federal Republic of Nigeria.

Dabiri-Erewa emphasized, the need for Nigeria to follow suit, as the Nigerian Diaspora cannot afford to be left out given their humongous contributions to the Nigerian economy.

Prince Ade Omole, Chairman Nigerian Diaspora Voting Council in his presentation before the committee, explained that the Diaspora Voting Bill which has passed second reading in the National Assembly is seeking to amend Section 77 and 117 of the constitution of the Federal Republic of Nigeria, to allow Nigerians in the Diaspora participate in electoral process. Omole further said that the entire Nigerian Capital (stock) budget is \$20 billion and the budget of Nigeria is between \$30 to \$32 billion dollars, adding that Nigerians in the Diaspora remit about that amount of money to the economy.

Participants who joined The NIDCOM Boss via zoom from all continents of the world for the Public Hearing by the Nigerian Senate include: Dr Pemus Eweama--Chairperson of Nigerian Association of Western Australia, and Mr. Ayo Akinfe--CANUK, United Kingdom. Others were Prince Ben Okoli -- NICASA President, South Africa, Dr Yetunde Omede-- Rep Women, USA., Amb. Edward Sarki--DG Diaspora Group, Gombe State, Wale Adesanya-- Nigerian-Canadian Business Network and Abiodun Odunuga-- France and Youth.Other presenters are Dr. James Iyore-- Nigerian Physician Advocacy Group, Obed Monago--Chairman, NIDO Americas, Engr. Nazeer Alhassan--Kingdom of Saudi Arabia and Dr. Abba Elgujja--Infection Control Unit, King Khaled University Hospital, Riyadh, Kingdom of Saudi Arabia all expressed their desire to participate in the electioneering process in Nigeria, and called for an amendment to the Constitution to make Diaspora

voting a reality.





NATIONAL DIASPORA POLICY: A Step Towards Quality Implementation

Ollowing the ratification of the National Diaspora Policy by the Federal Executive Council, the Nigerians in Diaspora Commission (NIDCOM) has been keen on a successful implementation of this holistic policy. Towards achieving this, a training for some staff of the Commission on Project Management was facilitated in collaboration with EU-IOM, with the theme: Project Management; Key To Policy Implementation. The training which aims to build staff capacity towards efficient implementation of the policy was held on 4th to 6th June, 2021 at Sawalino Hotel, keffi, Nasarawa State.

Ms. Elizabeth Poage, the representative of Chief of Mission IOM, in her welcome address, reemphasised the need for strategic implementation of the policy while noting that a policy without implementation is of no benefit. The programme was declared open with a remark by Hon. Abike Dabiri-Erewa, Chairman/CEO Nigerians in Diaspora Commission (NiDCOM), who was represented by Mrs Victoria Adeosun, NiDCOM Director of Administration.

On Day One of the programme, Mr Amos Ojo, trained the participants on Project Management, Project Cycle Management, key Qualities of a good project and Key project Documents after which an evaluation was conducted before the closing. Day Two was anchored by Mr. Joshua Awoleye and centred on the topics; Theory of Change and how it can be used to track change throughout the project cycle, Monitoring and Evaluation in Project Cycle and Logical Framework.

The programme came to an end with a review of the previous day after which Mr Kolawale Olugbemi facilitated interactive sessions on Financial Management, Understanding basic financial management concepts and processes, Developing competence in budgeting and financial reporting, Compliance and financial control in promoting Value for Money (VFM) and Complaint expenditures. The three-day training further proves that the adoption of the National Diaspora Policy is a great achievement and a highly commendable feat for the Commission. The training was very practical and in-line with the Policy, mission, vision and objectives of the Commission.





JUNE 12: STAKEHOLDERS CANVASS FOR MORE PARTICIPATION OF DIASPORANS IN NATION BUILDING

n commemoration of the 2021 Democracy Day celebrations in Nigeria, the Nigerians in Diaspora Commission (NiDCOM) held a two-hour webinar session in conjunction with the Nigeria-American Public Affairs Committee (NAPAC) and the Nigerian Think-Thank Group, to set the road map for the participation of Nigerian Diaspora in nation building. A resounding commendation was given to the President Muhammadu Buhari-led administration on the declaration of June 12, as Democracy Day.

The election was acclaimed the freest democratic process in Nigeria's political history and won by MKO Abiola on June 12, 1993 though annulled by the Gen. Ibrahim Babangida Military-led Administration. It is on this standpoint that a cross section of Stakeholders across the globe have called for more inclusion and participation of Nigerians in the Diaspora in the democratic process in Nigeria. At the webinar, a former British High Commissioner to Nigeria, Mr Paul Arkwright in his speech commended President Muhammadu Buhari for being on the path of democratic progress with a lot of improvement in the years to come.

Arkwright, who was one of the panelists, however listed four areas of improvement to include: increase in representation of women and youth in democratic process in Nigeria, reduction in take home pay of the National Assembly and political office holders, reduction in the influence of money in politics and adequate representation of all ethnic groups, especially the minority groups in the electoral and democratic process. Commending the role of NiDCOM so far, the envoy emphasised the role of the Nigerians in the Diaspora and their contributions to national development, stressing that they must be involved in the democratic process.



Contributing to the discussion, Hon. Abike Dabiri-Erewa, the Chairman/CEO of Nigerians in the Diaspora Commission (NIDCOM) said the Commission will continue to engage the diaspora, particularly women and youth, stressing that the recently approved diaspora policy provides a holistic map for constructive diaspora engagement. She echoed the need for diaspora voting, adding that the issue was exhaustively tabled at the recent Public hearing on Constitutional amendment. The NIDCOM boss also advised Nigerians living abroad to speak well about their country, Nigeria and join hands with the government to contribute their quota to national development.

In another contribution, Dr Veronica Ufogbure, Chair of NAPAC stressed the need to lift Nigeria up, and participate actively in the electoral process as being done in the US and other European countries. She, however, listed eight areas of interventions which include security, conversation, misinformation, trade, wired fraud and corruption, election process participation, I.T expertise and creation of a Global Nigerian Diaspora Think-Thank group, among others.





In addition, one of the children of late Chief MKO Abiola and winner of June 12,1993 Presidential Election, Abdulmumin Abiola, reiterated the fact that Nigeria is a great country and everyone must participate in the democratic process.

Abiola, who clad in his father's June 12 insignia dress, thanked President Muhammadu Buhari for recognising June 12 as democracy Day after 25 years of the annulled election, urging Nigerians not only to participate in the democratic process but to also hold the leaders accountable. Mr Bayo Adedosu, a resident in Canada, stressed the need for Nigerians to show patriotism, while calling on leaders to be accountable.

Mr Tony Isama lauded President Muhammadu Buhari's massive strides in infrastructural development while calling for collaboration among the numerous diaspora groups.

Other speakers Mr Audu Maikori, Dr Nelson Aloya, Mr Bolaji Lewis and Mr Stephen Akinfodu gave their appreciation to the Buhari administration 's recognition of June 12, as Democracy Day and urged Nigerians in Diaspora to leverage their influence, time and resources to contribute to the growth and development of the country. It was agreed at the platform that Nigeria is home to everyone wether you are home or abroad, the development process of this nation is a collective responsibility so everyone must join hands together to achieve this goal.

UFC'S KAMARU USMAN TO BUILD AN ACADEMY IN NIGERIA

DRUG REHABILITATION /ADVOCACY: NIGERIANS IN DIASPORA PLEDGE THEIR SUPPORT.

In recent years there has been an increase in number of drug abuse cases in Nigeria. Drug abuse Can be described as the excessive use of psychoactive drugs such as alcohol, pain medications, or illegal drugs. Drug abuse is a huge issue that has been difficult to address for many years, particularly among youths. As we all know, drug abuse is not only harmful to one's health but also has negative impact on the society. As such, the Nigerians in Diaspora Commission (NIDCOM) and the National Drug Law Enforcement Agency (NDLEA) are teaming up to encourage some Nigerians who have indicated interest to build more rehabilitation centres in Nigeria in order to combat the alarming rise in drug abuse.

The Chairman/CEO of NIDCOM, Hon. Abike Dabiri-Erewa made this known when she paid a courtesy visit to Brigadier General Muhammad Buba Marwa, Chairmanof the National Drug Law Enforcement Agency (NDLEA) in his office in Abuja. During the visit, Hon Dabiri-Erewa stated that with the alarming rate of drug abuse in the country, some Nigerians in the Diaspora have shown interest in building rehabilitation centres across the country but their major challenge she said is land and a lot of them are even willing to offer free counselling services.

The visit to NDLEA has become necessary, according to the NIDCOM boss in the light of Zainab Aliyu's case, which was heard on May 14, 2019 in Saudi Arabia when Zainab was allegedly accused of drug trafficking and consequently sentenced to death but through the intervention of President Muhammadu Buhari, facilitated by Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Nigerians in Diaspora Commission, NIDCOM, Zainab Aliyu and Ibrahim Ibrahim were set free.

The intriguing thing here is that judgement on the matter is yet to be adjudicated giving room for those culpable walking about freely without hindrance. Dabiri-Erewa added that "the culprits have been apprehended but they are walking about freely. It has been two years and nothing has been done. "Zainab Aliyu who was present at the visit with her sister appreciated the intervention of President Muhammad Buhari in her case and also pleaded for justice, "my case has been in court for over two years and some months now. All I want is justice for me and other victims like me", she said. The Chairman, NDLEA, Brigadier Buba Marwa who commended NiDCOM for its excellent public image and accomplishments within a short period, revealed his interest in the case and assured that his office will not relent until justice is served. Brigadier General Marwa gave assurances that the airports are now more strict and efforts have been intensified in the airports to safeguard innocent citizens and reduce drug related incidence.

Marwa also welcomed NiDCOM's initiative where by Diaspora Nigerians are willing and ready to embark on sensitization and counselling against drug use, abuse and trafficking especially by young adults and the building of more rehabilitation centres across the country. The NDLEA Boss stated further that more rehabilitation centres are needed, "as we seize and prosecute, we should also consider those who abuse substances and find ways to rehabilitate them", he said.





NiDCOM Boss commends DOWA, a diaspora youth NGO

he youths undeniably make up the larger percentage of the society: places of worship, the workplace, the academia, and even in a country. A youth according to the United Nations, is a young person that "falls into the age bracket of 15-24 years of age" but the National Youth Policy of Nigeria pegs the youth age bracket between 18-35 years, without any prejudice to other standards as set by member Countries.

This explanation tend to vary due to geographical, economic, political, biological, and socio-cultural factors, as some older adults claim to be 'young at heart'. But that's a debate for another day. The online census site, worldometer records the global population as 7.9 billion. Based on census given, a study from the UNFPA, puts it that, "today's generation of young people is absolutely massive: Some 1.8 billion people are between ages 10 and 24. Most of them live in developing countries, often comprising a huge proportion of the population... Around 175 million young people in low-income countries cannot read a full sentence. Among those aged 15-24, some 500 million live on less than \$2 a day, and over 73 million are unemployed..."

We will agree that youths have been influential in matters that concern a nation; agents to steer growth or subversion. We have seen youths act as voice for the voiceless; trailblazers in different careers. In addition, it has also been recognised how such raw force if driven to the darkside can wreck havic, chaos and fear among people, especially in recent times. The Nigerian Diaspora with over 17 million people, just like other communities, have a larger fraction of people belonging to the youths. Though most of them have no iota of any connection to their ancestral homes, these set of generations, however, have in one way lived up to (if not surpassed) the number of achievements of those before them. It is in this stride, that in their individual communities in the Diaspora, try to trace the dots that navigate them homewards, or have a bit of connection to their ancestry through various platforms.

One of such is the Doing Good Work in Africa (DOWA) NGO. The DOWA NGO, is a non-profit initiative geared towards connecting students in the United States to African-based entities focused on providing scalable solutions to commonplace challenges. Hon. Abike Dabiri-Erewa, Chairman/CEO, Nigerians in Diaspora Commission (NiDCOM), gave a commendation to the diaspora youth NGO, for supporting students and impacting future growth in Africa.

The encomium was detailed in a statement issued in Abuja by the Commission's Head of Media, Public Relations and Protocols Unit, Mr. Abdur-Rahman Balogun, to mark the first year of the group. Dabiri-Erewa described the thoughtful action of DOWA as timely and a critical tool for development of Africa as a whole, which she said: "Brain gain is a necessity for the development of Africa. This type of effort will go a long way in making tremendous impacts in the development of our youths in the diaspora". "For placing 27 students on internship and conducting several educational webinars with over 400 attendees from over 17 countries within a year of its establishment, your efforts is hereby applauded", she added.

The Nigerian youths, home and abroad, is just as important to all of us, as anything. Indeed, if directed well, they have a lot to offer not just for Nigeria but the world. The likes of Junior Steve Ezeonu, Jessica O. Matthews, Anthony Joshua, Kamaru Usman, Ann-Marie Imafidon, John Boyega, just to mention but a few, are Nigerian youths in Nigeria, making a mark of excellence in their fields of endeayour.

Thankfully, some organisations have recognised the youth and are strategising how best to engage them for nation-building.





Kindly allow me to recall in June, the Nigerians in Diaspora Organisation, Europe (NiDOE) had flagged off its Diaspora Youth Inclusion Programme. The webinar event was geared towards getting Nigerian youths in the Diaspora, particularly resident in parts of Europe, involved in the activities of Nigeria's development, using their intellectual, material and human resources. We need many more like these that can empower the Nigerian youth, at home and in the Diaspora, for greater deeds to uphold Nigeria's dignity.NiDCOM, which is a predominantly youth-friendly Commission, believes in the power of the Nigerian youth, especially the Nigerian youth in the Diaspora.

In that stance, it plans to have a full-on youth engagement meeting with second and third generations in the Diaspora, to understand them, listen to their concerns and drive them to see ways they could connect with Nigeria and its policies for nation-building. Permit me to end with this quote by the Indian Activist and Nobel Peace Prize recipient, Kailash Satyarthi: "The power of youth is the common wealth for the entire world. The faces of young people are the faces of our past, present and the future. No segment in the world can match with the power, idealism, enthusiasm and courage of the young people".

17 MILLION NIGERIANS IN DIASPORA: NIDCOM LAUNCHES DIASPORA DATA MAPPING PORTAL

ith an estimated population of about 17Million Nigerians in the Diaspora and an Annual Remittances of about 25billion dollars, no doubt, the Nigerian Diaspora is an economic demographic that cannot be ignored in National Development. Riding on the standpoint of purposeful leadership, dynamism and dedication displayed by the Chairman/CEO, Nigerians in Diaspora Commission, NIDCOM, Hon Abike Dabiri-Erewa has inaugurated a holistic and realistic data Portal and Registry of Nigerians in the Diaspora in Abuja.

Inaugurating the Diaspora Mapping Portal, the Minister of State, Foreign Affairs and Supervising Minister to NIDCOM, Amb. Zubairu Dada, stated emphatically that the Portal will enhance Diaspora participation in demographic and national planning as well as budgeting purposes at all levels of governance. Amb. Dada maintained that it is a thing of pride and urged every Nigerian in the Diaspora to get on board and be registered as one of the critical tools of purposeful engagement, encouragement and enablement of the Diaspora community for national development which is in line with the vision, mission and mandate of NiDCOM.

The Chairman/CEO of the Commission, Hon. Abike Dabiri-Erewa, stressed that the event was to create awareness and develop a collaborative agenda for the development of a credible data base of Nigerians in the Diaspora. According to her, "it was necessary to set up a reliable and scalable data base of the Nigerian Diaspora to provide for engagement of the Nigerian Diaspora in the Policies, Project and Programmes of the Nigerian government at all levels.

Dabiri-Erewa further asserted that in 2020, the Commission started the establishment of data mapping sites which served, as the foremost capturing platform for raw data in over 10 countries and it is expected that at least 20 countries will be captured in 2021.

The NiDCOM Boss, gave assurance that the Commission is investing in high-tech mechanisms such as AI systems and advanced data analytic systems in order to recognise and bring Nigerian Diaspora together. Mr. Franz Celestin, the Chief of Mission, International Organisation for Migration (IOM), also stated that the launch of the data mapping platform is a historical moment for the Commission, the Nigerian Diaspora and the country. Celestin maintained that this will bring potentials, encourage Diaspora to invest, identify the sociodemographic spread and economic profile of its Diaspora. He encouraged Nigerians in the Diaspora to make optimum use of this great opportunity.

This was corroborated by the representative of the European Union Elena Zezelidou who commended NIDCOM's dedication and commitment to ensuring Diaspora Portal is launched as well as the ratification of The National Diaspora Policy by the Federal Executive Council. Meanwhile, The Head of Technology, Transfer and Innovation (TTI) Department, (NIDCOM) Hon. Abdulrahman Terab, remarked that the platform is specially designed to be user-friendly, with seamless questions, aimed at sorting, marking and analysing data use to make sense of the future. In the meantime, Nigerians in Diaspora can log on to www.nidcom.gov.ng/registry to access the portal. As at time of inauguration, about a Hundred Nigerians in the Diaspora have registered.

FOOD CORNER

Jollof Rice is said to have its origin from the Senegambia region of west Africa, in the ancient Wolof or Jolof Empire, during the 14th-16th centuries. It is considered to be parts of modern-day Senegal, The Gambia, and Mauritania. But most part of west African countries eat rice but no one can beat the Nigerian Signature Jollof Rice.

No party is complete without jollof. Hope staying away from home for a long time hasn't made you forget how to prepare jollof rice? I am talking to my Diaspora Nigerians. Here we go:

INGREDIENTS

- 1. Vegetable oil
- 2. Tomatoes (Tin or sachet and fresh tomato purée)
- 3. Pepper
- 4. Salt
- 5. Onions
- 6. Seasoning Cubes
- 7. Meat Stock
- 8. Rice9. Curry
- 10. Thyme

METHOD OF PREPARATION

- •Parboil your rice and set aside in a sieve.
- 1. Set a clean dry pot on low heat on fire. Add the vegetable oil and allow to heat up for one minute.

- 2. Slice the onions into any shape of choice and add up into the heated oil to sautee for three minutes, to give it a slight caramelized texture, (by doing this, it gives the Jollof a sweet aroma). Then pour in the Tomato purée and fry for about four minutes.
- 3. Add the Ginger and Garlic, already blended and fry along with the Tomato paste for three minutes. If you keep it frying for a long time, it will burn.
- 4. Pour in the blended peppers and tomatoes. Mix them all up and stir fry for 20 minutes on medium heat, remove excess water and blandness.
- 5. Add the Thyme, Curry powder and meat Stock. Add a bit of salt and seasoning cubes, to get your desired taste.
- 6. Pour the parboiled Rice inside the pot and stir, Make sure you stir the Rice properly until you cover each grain of Rice with the sauce. cover it up.
- 6. Once, the rice comes to a boiling point, reduce the heat to medium-low immediately and continue to cook until the rice is done about 20 to 25 minutes.
- NB. You don't want your rice to be marshy, so you regulate the water and don't put plenty of water when cooking it. You can add some water, little by little, till the rice is soft enough. Serve with Fried Chicken, Spicy Grilled Chicken, Grilled Tilapia Fish, plantain, Gizzards or any protein of your choice.

TOUR NIGERIA: KOGI STATE

elcome to one of the safest state in Nigeria, Kogi, located in the North-Central part of Nigeria. Kogi State is blessed with human and mineral resources and tourist sights. Kogi State houses 10 other states. The state is also known as the Confluence State that connect two African rivers, Niger and Benue.Kogi State is a key centre of commercial trade in Nigeria with investment opportunities across the 21 Local Government Areas (LGA). There are three main ethnic groups and languages in Kogi: Igala, Ebira, and Okun with others such as Bassa, Ogori Magongo, and Oworo .It will interest you to know that the name "Nigeria" was coined in Lokoja, Kogi State by Flora Shaw in the hill of Mount Patti, the future wife of Baron Lugard, a British colonial administrator, while gazing out at the River Niger. Tourist attractions in Kogi State includes:

Lord Lugard House: The Lugard Rest House is today a mini museum of colonial history, and has been left untouched since Flora and Sir Lord Frederick Lugard left it.



In appreciation of the beauty of Mount Patti, and its cooling climate, they built the rest house on the mountain top. In front of the house is a statue of the couple holding hands. The house is located perfectly as a surveillance post to overview Lokoja.

Mount Patti: The lush green Mount Patti is 458.3 metres high and located in Lokoja, capital city of Kogi state. It is from here people gaze up at it's magnificence with awe. Located in the confluence of the Rivers Niger and Benue, the area has been inhabited for thousands of years by many ethnic communities and was previously a centre for trade. Lokoja is the first administrative capital of modern day Nigeria.

The Confluence of Rivers Niger and BenueThe River Niger is Africa's third largest and the main river of western Africa. It is over 4180 km long and passes through Guinea, Mali, Niger, Benin and Nigeria. The River Benue is 1,400 km long and a tributary of the Niger River.

The two rivers meet in a colorful Y-shape with the brownish River Niger and green River Benue. It is one of Nigeria's most beautiful natural wonders.

- •Ogidi (An African town with formations of Igneous Rock mountains and a traditional art & craft industry) and natural land features hills and terrains that serve as hiking trails.
